A celebrated American actor from Los Angeles, California, Julian Works entered audiences' hearts with a wide array of guest starring roles in acclaimed television shows, such as "The Closer" (TBS), "Southland" (TBS), "NCIS: Los Angeles" (CBS), "Modern Family" (ABC), and "The Fosters" (Freeform). He followed-up with memorable major recurring guest starring roles in Academy Award-winner John Ridley's crime-drama series, "American Crime" (ABC) and Academy Award-winner Dustin Lance Black and Academy

Award-nominee Gus Van Sant's drama mini-series, "When We Rise" (ABC). He also starred in a memorable recurring guest star role opposite Brenton Thwaites in Greg Berlanti's action-adventure-crime series, "Titans" (DC Universe/HBO Max).

In film, Works most recently landed the coveted, strong supporting role of "Lieutenant Martinez" opposite KJ Apa and Jason Alexander in the biopic of film icon James Stewart, **JIMMY**. The film will be in theaters November 6, 2026. He previously starred in the historical sports-drama, *The Long Game*, based on the acclaimed novel by Humberto G. Garcia, in the lead role of High School Texas State Champion Golfer "Joe Trevino" opposite Jay Hernandez, Dennis Quaid, and Cheech Marin. The film premiered at the 2023 SXSW festival and won the coveted Audience Award, Narrative Spotlight, with *The Hollywood Reporter* highlighting Works' "terrific performance" and "the fire and conflict in the seemingly self-assured Joe as the stuff movie moments are made of." The film was released theatrically nationwide in April 2024 with the lead cast visiting the White House for a special screening with members of the Administration, Congressmen, leaders of the Hispanic Heritage Foundation, and other dignitaries. The film was released worldwide on Netflix on July 12, 2024, to high acclaim, immediately dethroning *Beverly Hills Cop: Axel Foley* for the #1 coveted spot for a week and remained in the Top Ten for three weeks. Works also won the 2024 Imagen Foundation Award for Best Supporting Actor for his performance alongside Jay Hernandez for Best Actor, while the film won Best Picture of the Year.

In television, Works recently starred in a series regular role opposite Emmy Award-nominee Rob Lowe and Gina Torres in Emmy Award-winners Ryan Murphy and Tim Minnear's acclaimed action-drama-thriller series, "9-1-1: Lone Star" (20th Television/Hulu/Fox). A spin-off of

“9-1-1” starring Academy Award-nominee Angela Bassett, with whom he also shared the screen, Works plays young, probationary firefighter “Mateo Chavez” – an immigrant ‘dreamer’ who rises the ranks to become the ultimate hero to his firefighting crew, and serves as a paragon of courage and the American dream.

Works also appeared in a lead role in the Blumhouse anthology film series, “Into the Dark: School Spirit” (Hulu) and a memorable supporting role in Blumhouse’s, “Paranormal Activity: The Marked Ones” (Paramount). He also starred in a supporting role opposite Emmy Award-winner Finn Wittrock in the drama feature film, *Locating Silverlake*, and opposite Academy Award-nominee Timothée Chalamet in the drama feature, *Beautiful Boy* (Amazon). He starred in a memorable supporting lead role in the Sundance Film Festival-nominated drama feature, *All She Can*, and recently also played a supporting role opposite Emmy Award-winner Brian Cox and Sinqua Walls in the war-drama feature, *Mending the Line* (Sony).

A talented music aficionado and MC, Works has also released over 10 music tracks under the moniker ‘Jules Works’ on major streaming platforms (Spotify, iTunes, Apple Music) to the delight of his growing fanbase. From high-tempo songs like “In It” opposite renowned rapper and Nipsey Hussle crew member J. Stone and mid-tempo songs like “Mission” and “Affiliated,” to old-school vibes like “Solid” and “Trends,” Works is cementing his place in the world of hip-hop by speaking about his upbringing, family, culture, struggle, and his ambitious quest for success.
